



Don't debate. Ensure you always keep your regularly scheduled hygiene appointments.



01: Gum disease is common & preventable.

02: There are no signs in the beginning.

03: It is caused when plaque (bacterial film) builds up & causes gums to become infected.

04: The early stage is called gingivitis.

05: With gingivitis, your gums become red & swollen, & can bleed easily when you brush.

06: Gingivitis can be reversed.

07: If left untreated, gingivitis can

progress into a more serious form of gum disease called periodontitis.

08: The symptoms for periodontitis are the same as for gingivitis, but involve more of the supporting structure.

09: Periodontal disease can lead to tooth loss & the destruction of supporting bone in your jaw.

10: Heart disease, diabetes, premature childbirth, toxemia and other systemic diseases have been linked to gum disease.

RECONTOURING!

Is crown lengthening an option is for you?

You may be most familiar with descriptions of crown lengthening when it is used cosmetically to improve a *too gummy* smile. This is when excess gum tissue is removed to improve appearance by revealing more tooth, and the procedure is called *gum contouring* or *gum recontouring*.

- Crown lengthening is also a wonderful option to restore function. Here are two examples where crown lengthening can help by reshaping the gum and supporting tissues to expose more of the tooth...
- When a tooth is broken or decayed below the gum, we need to see it to fix it. As well, if we place a filling or a restoration cap in an area below the gumline, you need to be able to reach it during home care to eliminate the risk of periodontal disease from bacteria that isn't being regularly cleared away. Crown lengthening eliminates both concerns.
- When there is an insufficient amount of tooth left to support a filling, or a crown.



Improve teeth size & gum line.

Crown lengthening can:

- Balance the appearance of your smile.
- Enable you to retain your teeth.
- Improve the condition of gums around the crown.

Your gums are just as important as your pearly white teeth to have a beautiful smile!

Be Confident!

Choose instant “orthodontic veneers”!

Porcelain veneers are ultra-modern porcelain shells that are bonded directly to your own teeth to camouflage smile flaws. They can be thinner than a contact lens, yet so strong and so transformative that they have been called “Instant Orthodontics.”

Cosmetic porcelain veneers can remake a crooked and uneven smile into a glamorous one – that’s completely natural looking! Veneers can also:

- **Shorten** teeth that are too long;
- **Lengthen** teeth that are too short;
- **Re-proportion** your smile;
- **Whiten**;
- and *much more*.


There’s more? Absolutely. Veneers can actually plump out wrinkles around the mouth – taking years off your appearance – without surgery!



Facts on dental sealants

What Is A Dental Sealant?

- A dental sealant is a liquid plastic material that hardens to form a shield over the chewing surfaces of the teeth.

Why Get Sealants?

- To keep out the germs and food that cause tooth decay.
- Sealants prevent decay from ever starting.

Who Should Get Sealants?

- Children should get sealants on their permanent molars as soon as the teeth come in.
- Adults, especially patients afflicted with dry mouth, which affects about one-third of the adult population.
- Sealants also protect worn and sensitive surfaces on adult teeth.

How Are Sealants Put On?

- The tooth is cleaned, dried, and prepared for bonding with the sealant.
- The liquid sealant hardens in just a few seconds.

The best way you can help prevent tooth decay is to brush and floss regularly. Sealants and prescription fluoride used together provide the best defense against tooth decay.
